Concrete Polisher Tradesman Review Course/Exam
Examiner: **Roy Bowman**

This course is the preparation class for the Concrete Polishing Council Craftsman Certification. The course covers the basic knowledge to prepare and execute a polished concrete flooring installation. A Concrete Polishing Tradesman is a person who has demonstrated knowledge about proper procedures to polish concrete but lacks sufficient work experience to qualify as a Concrete Polishing Craftsman. Concrete Polishing Craftsman is a certified Tradesman and has verified work experience of 4500 hours directly attributed to surface preparation, grinding, edging, chemical application, honing, polishing, and/or polishing equipment maintenance.

Learning Objectives:

1. Analyze planning for concrete polishing
2. Support communication with the concrete contractor and the specifier
3. Discuss surface preparation, grinding, edging, chemical application, honing, and polishing
4. Determine best safety practices


For Concrete Polishing Tradesman: CPC will grant certification only to those candidates who obtain a passing grade on the online examination. The two-hour examination consists of 50 multiple-choice questions. The passing grade for the examination is 70%.

Individuals with Concrete Polishing Tradesman certification can upgrade to Concrete Polishing Craftsman status upon submittal and approval of verified sufficient work experience. Recertification is necessary every five years and requires successful completion of an examination.

For Concrete Polishing Craftsman: CPC will grant certification only to those candidates who have obtained Tradesman Certification PLUS:
• Possess 4,500 hours of actual on-the-job polishing* experience.

*Polishing experience includes concrete surface preparation, grinding, edging, chemical application, honing, polishing, and polishing equipment maintenance. Verification of the work experience by the candidate's employer(s) is required.

Brickyard Crossing Golf

Originally designed by legendary Indiana architect Bill Diddel, the Speedway Golf Course first opened in 1929 with 9 holes outside the track and 9 in the Speedway infield. Nine additional holes were added in 1965, and the 27-hole facility featured a championship 18-hole layout outside the track, with the "Track Nine" still on the infield. This layout endured until world-renowned architect Pete Dye redesigned the facility in 1992, and the renamed Brickyard Crossing Golf Course opened in 1993 in its current form: 14 holes to the East of the backstretch and four holes in the infield.

The golf course has hosted a myriad of professional events, beginning with the 500 Festival Open in May of 1960. The tournament, which ran for nine years from 1960 to 1968, was played on Memorial Day weekend. Rounds 1-3 took place on Thursday through Saturday, with a break on Sunday for race day, and the final round was played on Monday. In addition, Brickyard Crossing became one of the few courses to host a PGA and LPGA tournament in the same year when the 500 Ladies Classic was played in June of 1968. The PGA Champions Tour visited the course from 1994-2000, and most recently, the LPGA Tour held the Indy Women in Tech Championship for three years from 2017-2019.

Indianapolis Motor Speedway Museum

The Indianapolis Motor Speedway is one of the oldest and most revered motorsports facilities in the world. Since its construction in 1909, this famous 2.5-mile racetrack has become a National Historic Landmark and a legend in the world of auto racing.

At the Indianapolis Motor Speedway Museum, our mission is to celebrate and preserve the history behind the Indianapolis Motor Speedway and the Indianapolis 500.

The Indianapolis Motor Speedway Museum officially opened in 1956 on a non-profit basis, eventually operating under the Indianapolis Motor Speedway Foundation. But the Museum's origins can be traced back to 1945, when Anton Hulman Jr. purchased the Indianapolis Motor Speedway after World War II.

Hulman worked with the Museum's first curator Karl Kizer and three-time Indy 500 winner Wilbur Shaw to save our beloved Speedway and revive the Indianapolis 500. After Shaw's death in 1954, Hulman formally opened the Museum, establishing a place to showcase historic racing vehicles and memorabilia.

Back then, the Museum only had 12 cars on display, including Shaw's race-winning Maserati. But now, the Museum has become one of the world's premier collections of racing automobiles and artifacts—with more than 55,000 artifacts and over 150 vehicles.

In fact, the Indianapolis Motor Speedway Museum has been named one of USA Today's Top Three Best Sports Attractions in the Country. Our facility currently boasts 80,000 sq. ft. of vintage cars, trophies, photographs, fine art, and other artifacts that capture the cultural significance of motorsports. And each year, we welcome more than 140,000 visitors, as race fans from around the world make the pilgrimage to the Racing Capital of the World.
